

# Blue and Yellow Flag, A Powerful Symbol

The Ukrainian flag consists of two horizontal bands of equal width, with blue on the top and yellow on the bottom. The combination is commonly decoded as the sky above and the endless fields of wheat beneath it.

The combination of colors goes back to the 13th century. A golden lion on a blue background was depicted on the coat of arms of Lviv during the reign of Prince Danylo Romanovych. The flag got its modern look in 1848 when revolutionaries who intended to liberate Ukraine's western regions from Austro-Hungarian authority developed this flag based on the hues of the coat of arms of the city of Lviv.

The flag has become a symbol of national pride and unity. It flows at public events and over government buildings and is a common sight at sporting events and cultural festivals.

- A symbol of hope, it flutters over resilient Ukrainian cities and towns.
- A symbol of support, its blue and yellow fills squares and news feeds around the globe.
- A symbol of resistance, people continue to make and protect Ukrainian flags even under the temporary occupation.
- A symbol of sacrifice, it covers the coffins of heroes who were killed

defending the country.

On Sunday, September 17 at 4 p.m., we welcome the Kyiv Symphony Orchestra & Chorus (KSOC) to First Presbyterian Church to present a concert as part of their "Hope for Ukraine" tour. Be sure to attend and bring your family and friends.
