Pastor Dawn Will Be Out Of The Office



Faith & Fiction meets the first Monday of each month, 7:30 - 8:30 PM in Room N-123 through April. <u>Here</u> is this year's Reading List.


Security/Safety Organizational Meeting

Over her long and distinguished career inspired by Russian icons, Pawlowska has worked with such items as wood, fabric, copper, Plexiglas, and found objects. Her work is original and evocative, ranging from startling dramatic expression to ethereal contemplative beauty that draws the viewer
