Scott received his Bachelor's degree in classical guitar performance from Georgia State University under the instruction of John Sutherland, a protege of Andres Segovia. He also has a Master of Music degree from Adams State University in Alamosa, Colorado. In 1995 he founded the guitar department at Gainesville College in Gainesville, Georgia and was the Head of Guitar Studies there until 2000.

Matthias Young has taught at Callanwolde Fine Arts Center and Emory University. He is the Director of the Dunwoody Conservatory of Music. In 2017 he established the guitar program at Mount Vernon Presbyterian School in Atlanta, GA. Matthias is also an accomplished tenor soloist, having performed professionally for over a decade in assisting the choirs of St. Peters and St. Mary's Church in Rome, GA, and The First Presbyterian Church of Atlanta. Vernon Presbyterian Church in Atlanta, GA. His education includes undergraduate studies at Berry College and Georgia State University as well as graduate work at Boston University.



Lakewood Elementary Update

Lakewood staff and students were saddened by the inaccurate Tampa Times article published on February 10, 2020. Unfortunately, the editor did not visit the school and presented three-year-old information as if it were recent. We appreciate the opportunity to share the accurate information because Lakewood Elementary School is definitely on the rise!

Just a few of our recent celebrations:

- A 90% decrease in discipline referrals for student misconduct over the past two years.
- Our student absentee rate has declined from 19% to 6%.
- We have maintained a stable instructional staff with 100% of staff remaining throughout the school year.
- Our 5th graders are outscoring all 13 schools in the Transformation Zone in Science.
 Our 3rd, 4th and 5th grade scholars making learning gains has increased from 42% to 77%.

We have had multiple visits from Florida Education Commissioner Richard Corcoran and a visit from Frank Brogan, Assistant Secretary of Education with the United States Department of Education, as well as a city councilmen and staff from the Department of Education. All visitors expressed how pleased they were with the state of our school and spent hours touring the campus, talking to scholars and observing classrooms.
