

Spanish Flu---WWII---Polio---Man on the Moon---COVID-19---16 US Presidents

From 1916 to 2020, Agnes has witnessed some of the most amazing events of our country. Born in Detroit, Michigan, she has lived through three pandemics: the Spanish Flu, Polio, and now COVID-19.

Agnes graduated in 1934, when the high schools closed early due to lack of money. She attended Shorthand School where she

learned business skills that would enable her to work for Kelvinator Appliances Company, a steel company, and as a court reporter for 10 years. She retired at the age of 68 after a 21-year career as the secretary to the U.S. Court of Appeals Judge.

Agnes took off for several trips to Europe, visiting England, Scotland, Wales, and Switzerland. Turkey and Russia were also part of her travels. To sum up her travel experiences she said, "It was nice to visit, but not to stay."

When asked if she ever married, she replied, "Well, when the boys came home for the war, all the other girls grabbed them up and there was none left for me! So I missed being a Mrs., but I have had a great time."

Agnes is full of good quotes. About her remarkable age she said," Well, age sort of snuck up on me, but I just kept moving along."


Agnes attends the 11:00 service and has been involved with FPC since the 1950s.
