In January, Matthew had the privilege of bringing 42 high school music students in the school's elite choir and orchestra to New York City for a once-in-a-lifetime performance at St. Patrick's Cathedral.

"It was the first time the students had gone on a trip of this magnitude to perform," says Matthew. "It was a life-changing experience for many of them – the first time on an airplane, the first time performing in a cathedral like St. Patrick's, and the first time seeing snow. 


GriefShare Support Groups

Drive-Up Food Pantry

There has been a 331% increase over the last month in families assisted by the We Help Food Pantry. The number of families with children has more than doubled. The pantry expects to exceed the 11.3 million pounds of food given last year as the shut down continues.

Any Pinellas County resident with a valid Pinellas County driver's license may access the drive-through food pantry once per month. Food will be loaded right into your vehicle at 863 3rd Avenue North St. Petersburg 33701.

Hours are: Mon., Tue & Wed, 8:30 AM - 3:30 PM; Thur. 8:30 AM - 7:30 PM; Friday - 8:30 AM - 11:00 AM; Sat.& Sun. - Closed
