From MJ:


I came to 1st Pres last winter upon our arrival in St Pete. I first attended based on the recommendation of current choir

Carrying the Processional Cross

It has been a wonderful experience being the Crucifer at the 11 AM Worship Service. I accepted the opportunity because I wanted a chance to serve in this gentle way. It would offer a different perspective from my previous service to our church. Apart from learning what to do when, the experience brought not only a different point of view of our congregation but more personally what it means to carry the cross and be part of the worship service.



There were a few new words to learn too... There is the white 'alb' we wear and its belted 'cincture,' for instance. I learned how high and the correct form to hold the 6 lb. brass cross and staff. I learned to check the length of the first hymn to be sure my pace down the aisle allowed the choir and elders enough time to be seated before the end of the hymn!

I always smiled to nurture joy as we passed by you. The single disadvantage was that I love singing hymns and I missed doing that at the beginning and end of service! But walking down the aisle we hear your voices. There's a connection made there in hearing you sing. After pausing at the Chancel steps, with the bright lights bearing down, and Jack's playing of the organ, there is a moment to 'feel' our gathering together like this. Seated facing our congregation on the Chancel, it's much easier from that perspective (than from a pew) to see us as one group, as 'family', but also as individuals connected in this shared time and place in the presence of God. It is a wonderful experience to hear the choir and organ 'up close'. It is special to see the communion table more intimately as coming from a holy service to each of us.

I had intended to serve until the end of the year but I am moving soon which has already impacted my attendance. I'll be in Largo which may mean that I will find community with a church nearby. It was a privilege to serve as 'Crucifer'. I am very grateful to have had the experience. Thank you.
