Did you know that October is "Domestic Violence Awareness Month"? Several First Presbyterian members gained a deeper understanding of the far-reaching effects of domestic violence by attending the 23rd Annual CASA Peace Breakfast at the Coliseum on October 15.

First Presbyterian has been a long-time supporter of CASA, an acronym for "Community Action Stops Abuse." In the past 22 years, our congregation has contributed more than \$118,000.00. Last year alone, we donated \$7,560.00 in unrestricted gifts.

Domestic violence is often a "silent" evil, carrying the stigma of shame and embarrassment. Victims are often afraid to speak out. CASA provides a safe place where victims can find peace and aid during their time of need.

We ARE making a difference. When our congregation collected \$544.00 dollars as a "love offering" to CASA on a recent September Sunday, we decided to deliver the money in person. To thank First Presbyterian for our continued support, the CASA staff provided a table of eight to their Peace Breakfast. Several First Pres members attended, joining domestic violence victims, the Mayor, law enforcement officials, and community business leaders to stand up to silence about domestic violence. The room reverberated with unity, strength, and emotion. It was a lot like being in church!
