

If you attend in person, please remember:

- You will need to reserve a spot to attend. You can still RSVP for this Sunday's service until noon today. Please click **HERE** or call the Church Office (starting Monday morning).
- You will be required to wear a mask. If you forget one, we will have extras available.
- Hand sanitizer will be available in several easy-to-access spots for your safety.

- Valet parking will be available.
- Please note that the elevator will NOT be accessible.
- The sanctuary will have **one entrance** and **one exit** <u>only</u>. Signs will point you in the right direction.
- For your safety, prior to service, you will check in at the front doors, and be seated by ushers at a safe social distance.
- We ask that you do not congregate in the sanctuary at all after the service. If you wish to stop and visit with friends, make your way out of the sanctuary first and visit outside. We want you to spend as little time inside the sanctuary as possible.

#### To In-Person Worship in the Sanctuary!

The time has come for us to welcome you back safely! We return to In-Person Worship this Sunday, November 15, at 10 a.m. for those who feel comfortable worshipping in person.

Persons who are at high risk and feel uncomfortable coming back to worship in person are encouraged to take their own risk assessment and stay home if they feel uncomfortable. Those individuals can continue to enjoy our vibrant online worship service. For those of you at low risk and who feel comfortable coming back to in-person worship, we look forward to seeing you!

One thing to remember: **you must wear a mask**. If you forget one, we will have extras available. Plenty of hand sanitizer will be available for your safety, and you will move through the sanctuary one-way-in and one-way-out. Also, for your safety, you will be seated by ushers at a safe social distance. We ask that you not congregate in the sanctuary at all after the service. If you wish to stop and visit with friends, make your way out of the sanctuary first and visit outside. We want you to spend as little time inside the sanctuary as possible.

You will need to reserve a spot to attend in-person worship services starting with the November 15 service and moving forward.

(2) Call the Church Office (727-822-2031) Monday through Friday between 9 a.m. and noon. You will be asked a series of questions; some will be health-related. All information collected will be kept confidential. No reservations will be accepted after Friday at noon, and voicemail messages are <u>not</u> RSVPs. 

# **Our First Thanksgiving**

I don't remember all the details of our first Thanksgiving after my wife was diagnosed with Alzheimer's in 1997. That period is such a blur. I do know that all Martha's family gathered at her parents, Frank and Grace Elizabeth Cooper, and none were aware of Martha's diagnosis except for our children David, Rachel, and Kathryn.



Martha had just turned 50 when we heard her diagnosis on September 23<sup>rd</sup>. Our world wasn't turned upside down. It imploded before us. Martha's first words to me when we got home from the doctor's were, "I don't want to tell anyone. Not our children. Not my parents and brothers, and certainly not our friends."

But she was willing to talk with our good friend Lacy Harwell, whom some may remember as the long-time pastor at Maximo Presbyterian. Lacy encouraged us to visit his friend in Kentucky, Sr. Elaine Prevallet with the Sisters of Loretto community. "I've never met another person with Elaine's gift of discernment."

So four weeks after Martha's diagnosis, we went. The Loretto "motherhouse" was set on a large farm of about 800 acres, which gave us a lot of room to walk and talk and vent and pray while sharing with Sr. Elaine. (Down the road was a provider of a different sort of spirit, the Maker's Mark bourbon distillery, for any who cares to know).

Not far away is the Abbey of Gethsemani, which Thomas Merton helped make famous through his many writings. Martha and I drove there one evening for its Compline service and listened afterwards to a Fr. Matthew Kelty. Hearing him, I didn't know whether to laugh or cry, his homily was deep and poignant and humorous. He is one of the most incisive Christian speakers I've heard. He touched Martha so deeply that she asked to meet with him, which they did the next day for an hour.

After a restful week's visit with Sr. Elaine we drove back home, preparing for our first Thanksgiving in this strange and bizarre world they call Alzheimer's. More than two decades later—as I reflect on this year's Thanksgiving and on the responsible, life-loving adults our children have become—the voices of Sr. Elaine and Fr. Matthew still ring true and clear in my heart:

Fr. Matthew: "Suffering has something to do with salvation. We know that much. To say anything more is dangerous business."

Sr. Elaine, quoting an ancient Eastern Orthodox verse: "Fold the wings of your mind. Place your mind in your heart. Come into the presence of God."

Fr. Matthew to Martha: "You came calling on me. You are now one of us. So from now on, you are in my prayers." (Tears came to Martha's eyes as she listened.)

Sr. Elaine: "Your main calling at this time is to trust that you belong to God and not to yourselves. And to deepen your love for God and between yourselves."

May this Thanksgiving be meaningful and life-giving to you and your family during these weird and strange times.
